Tourism in Finland is active though not as powerful as e.g. in France or in Spain. In year 2014 there were 5,7 million overnight stays made by the tourists (http://www.visitfinland.fi/tutkimukset-ja-tilastot/majoitustilastot/). Most of them come from Russian but there are people arriving also from e.g. Sweden, Germany, Great Britain and Japan, most recently also from India (53 000 overnight stays).

Most popular things to explore are our wild and pure nature, Lappland (both winter and summer time), skiing centers and culture (e.g. architecture and Opera festivals). Finland is famous for the names like Alvar Aalto (architecture), Moomin (cartoon characters made by Tove Jansson) and Santa Claus. If people are travelling to central Finland they will most probably visit one of the thousands lakes, spend time in summer cottages and enjoy the pure nature.
